

WORLD SHIP TRUST MARITIME HERITAGE AWARDS

Award No 1 – for the film *Ghosts of Cape Horn*, presented in London, 19th November, 1980, by HRH Prince Philip to James R Donaldson and Keith Chritchlow. The occasion was the official launch of the World Ship Trust and premiere of the film.
